CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE AUTHORITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

Code of Conduct for the Authorities (i.e. Senate, Syndicate and Academic Council on Academic Affairs) of the University is indispensable as it is advocated by the State and Central Governments, which enables the authorities to work in virtue without showing any discrimination or favoritism.

Statement of dedication

1. We are obliged to discharge the official duties in order to promote Higher Education.
2. To our constituents, we owe honesty, accessibility, accountability, courtesy and fairness in all deeds.
3. To our colleagues in the Authorities (i.e., Syndicate, Senate and Standing Committee on Academic Affairs) of the University, we owe loyalty to shared norms and respect for differences and fairness.
4. We believe that the fundamental objective of the University is to serve the Students, parents, and teachers and to promote Higher Education and Research for the upliftment of the society.

- iv. Authorities must not accept gifts, benefits or favours except for incidental gifts or customary hospitality of nominal value.
