NEED FOR THE STUDY

BACKGROUND OF THE PROBLEM

The contemporary education system from the school or college / university is more of mechanism stuffing the young minds with dry information lending little opportunities for independent social awareness and involvement, some persons are prone to take social awareness and involvement rest of them do not wish to take any social awareness in life. The investigator, who has studied in different colleges and in different places with varied environment. During her studies, she had found that on social awareness and involvement among peer group is less .She also has special interest to assess the social awareness and involvement among student teachers who are the future teachers. Besides her interaction with others to some extent with students had feeling there is gap between social awareness and involvement among B.Ed. students which serves as a baseline to conduct this research study to identify the level of social awareness and involvement of the B.Ed. students. These exposures motivated the investigator to envisage / conceive the present problem is entitled "SOCIAL **AWARENESS** AND INVOLVEMENT AMONG B.ED. STUDENTS IN TAMIL NADU".

- B.Ed. Students posses average level of Social Involvement.
- Each of the independent variables involved in this study exerts a significant influence on Social Involvement among B.Ed. Students.
- There is a significant positive relationship between Social Awareness and Social Involvement among B.Ed. students.

METHODOLOGY - IN - BRIEF

Design: Descriptive

Method : Normative

Technique : Survey

Sample

A stratified representative sample of 2010 B.Ed. students from 30 Government aided and Private B.Ed. colleges in twenty two districts of Tamil Nadu, with due representation given to the variables, Gender and College Management Type.

Tools used

- 1. Social Awareness Achievement Test constructed and standardized by Baby, P. and Meenakshi, R. (2018)
- Social Involvement Scale constructed and standardized by Baby, P. and Meenakshi, R. (2018)
- 3. General information sheet structured by the investigator.

Statistical Treatments

- 1. Test of significance of difference between the means of large independent samples.
- 2. Pearson's Product Moment Correlation
- 3. Percentile Rank

HYPOTHESES VERIFICATION

Hypothesis 1: B.Ed. Students possess average level of Social Awareness

The empirical average of Social Awareness in this study is found to be 24.73 while the theoretical average is 20 only. This indicates that the B.Ed. Students possess above average level of Social Awareness. This shows that the B.Ed. Students are highly cognizant about societal activities. In other words, Social Awareness is found to be high among the student teachers.

Hence, Hypothesis 1 is Accepted.

Hypothesis 2: Each of the independent variables involved in this study exerts a significant influence on Social Awareness among B.Ed. Students

Twelve out of twenty two independent variables exerts a significant influence on Social Awareness among B.Ed. Students.

Hence, Hypothesis 2 is Partially Accepted

Hypothesis 3: B.Ed. Students possess average level of Social Involvement

The empirical average of Social Involvement in this study is found to be 54.88 while the theoretical average is 40 only. This indicates that the B.Ed. Students have above average level of Social Involvement. This shows that the B.Ed. Students are highly involved in societal activities. In other words, Social Involvement is found to be high among student teacher.

Hence, Hypothesis 3 is Accepted.

Hypothesis 4: Each of the independent variables involved in this study exerts a significant influence on Social Involvement among B.Ed. Students.

Ten out of twenty two independent variables exerts a significant influence on Social Involvement among B.Ed. Students.

Hence, Hypothesis 4 is Partially Accepted.

Hypothesis 5: There is a significant and positive relationship between Social Awareness and Social Involvement among B.Ed. Students.

The correlation (r) between Social Awareness and Social Involvement are found to be 0.628. This is found to be higher than that of the table value 0.044 at 0.05 level. Hence there is a significant and positive relationship between Social Awareness and Social Involvement.

Hence, Hypothesis 5 is Accepted.

CONCLUSIONS

The major conclusions emerged out of the present study are noted down.

EDUCATIONAL IMPLICATIONS

It is quite encouraging the present investigation revealed that the B.Ed. Students in general are found possessing above average level of Social Awareness. This authenticates that the B.Ed. students possess the required degree of Social Awareness. It is also revealed that Social Awareness is found lower among the Students who are dayscholars, who are from joint family who are studying second year, who were studied arts subject who are studying in the colleges situated in rural area, whose family income is adequate who belongs to Hindu religion, Who posses membership in Political Party, social club and NGO'S, who do not participate in dance & songs, and who do not participates in social Awareness programme possess lower level of Social Awareness as compared to their respective counterparts and hence these students should subjected to following activities for the promotion of social awareness.

- Developing the habit of newspaper reading by arranging news reading day.
- o Updation of current affairs
- o Encourage them to listen the news broadcast in Radio and Televisions.
- Motivate them to read out current affairs in the prayer
- Ask them to display important events / incidence of everyday in the college / hostel notice boards
- o Celebrating social awareness week.

- Conducting debate and discussions related to societal activities /
 incidences in the classroom or college as a whole
- By introducing the recent developments / advancements / achievements
 / inventions / awards related to the each course as a unit of the B.Ed.
 Programme.
- Creating social clubs in the colleges.

The striking fact that the present investigation also revealed that the social Involvement among B.Ed. students is found above average level .

It is further reveals that the lower level of Social Involvement is found among the male students, those who belongs to the age group of upto 21 years, who belongs to other than Hindu religion, who are in married, who belongs to heterodox family whose qualification is PG, who were studied science subjects, who are the non members of social club, who do not participates in dance & songs, social awareness programmes are found possessing lower level of Social Involvement than their counterparts, which needs further encouragement by the parents and college management for the active participation in the following activities with nurturing environment to enhance the Social Involvement for the relevant groups of students:

- > Arranging field visit
- ➤ Village adoption
- ➤ Blood donation, Health awareness, camps

- > Community engagement
- ➤ Provoke them to involve in any social service activities like cleaning the nearby villages, hospitals, schools, temple
- ➤ Make the students to render services in orphanages old age homes for a day in a month.

The change never happens in a single day in an individual. The human mind takes days together to accept or adopt anything. It is indepensive to warrant that the immediate actions towards the above said measures would enhance the cognizance and participation in societal activities among B.Ed. students, regular, frequent and compulsion over the activities presented supra paves ways to intensify the same which in turn improve the future citizens of our country who are in the fist of the teachers.
